Project: Manganese (Mn) Concentration and Enrichment in Metasedimentary Rocks of the Goldenville Group, Eastern Nova Scotia

This project is part of a broader research program investigating the sedimentology, stratigraphy, origin, and critical mineral potential of metasedimentary rocks of the Meguma terrane in Nova Scotia. This MSc project will focus on the sedimentology and mineralogy of manganeseenriched horizons in the upper Goldenville Group of the Meguma terrane. Manganese occurs in various forms, such as nodules, coticules when metamorphosed, and disseminated within mud and sand beds. The MSc candidate will conduct fieldwork, sampling, field mapping, and data collection to constrain the age and depositional environment of the sedimentary rocks. They will use bulk rock geochemical data, strontium-neodymium isotopic data, electron microprobe, and Raman spectroscopy, to determine the concentrations of Mn, the mineral phases that host the Mn, and the sedimentary or metamorphic processes that concentrated Mn in the Meguma terrane.

Our historic residential campus is home to just over 4,200 students from across Canada and internationally, as well as over 200 full-time faculty members dedicated to providing our students with a post-secondary education conducive to intellectual and personal growth. StFX offers graduate studies at the MSc and PhD levels and at any given time, 20 or more graduate students are active within the department. Graduate students have a peer group that enroll in common courses and students have a close collaborative relationship with their supervisor that is characteristic of small universities.
