Project Description	MERC, in partnership with Agnico Eagle, is looking for one MSc student to undertake a research project at the Macassa gold mine area in the Kirkland Lake gold mining camp. This is part of a larger research project in the Kirkland Lake camp focused on determining the structural, stratigraphic, and geochemical footprint of the gold system.
	This MSc candidate will focus on the spectral signature of the alteration assemblages. Agnico Eagle routinely collects multiparameter scans of drill core, including hyperspectral and XRF data. The spectral signature of the alteration assemblages will be calibrated using in-house XRD, petrographic and SEM analysis at MERC. The spectral signature will be evaluated in 3D space to determine proximity to different styles of mineralization and characterize the mineralogy of the alteration assemblages. This will develop a mineral footprint to the gold deposit for different host lithologies and different styles of mineralization that will contribute to improved exploration models and understanding of the gold metallogeny in the camp.
	This two-year, fully funded project involves extensive fieldwork in Kirkland Lake, including surface and subsurface mapping and logging of drill sections across the strata hosting the gold deposits.
